



HEALTH CARE EXECUTIVE ERIC MICHAEL DAVID JOINS BOARD OF HEALTHCARE CHAPLAINCY NETWORK

NEW YORK, NY (September 7, 2016)—Eric Michael David, M.D., J.D., of Rancho Sante Fe, Calif., has joined the board of directors of HealthCare Chaplaincy Network (HCCN). He also was a freelance consultant to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in the use of genomic technologies related to public health awareness; and assistant professor at The Rogosin Institute and adjunct faculty at The Rockefeller University, both in New York.
